

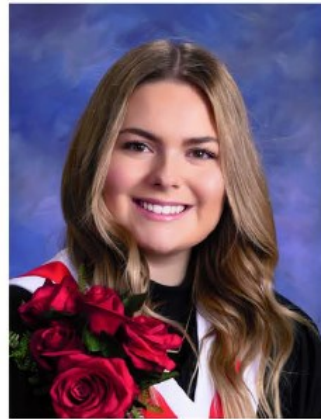

McCreary School Community Report 2022-2023

McCreary School is a K-12 school with an enrolment of 147 students. This year there were 14.5 professional staff, 7 educational assistants, a secretary, a librarian, 2 custodians, and 4 bus drivers.

McCreary School is proud to offer a variety of academic courses at the high school level, including Human Ecology, Industrial Arts, Electrical Construction, Power Mechanics, Guitar, Jazz Band, and a variety of Technology courses. For a moderately small school, we are able to provide many electives for students.

McCreary School offers a wide range of extra-curricular activities, including multiple individual and team sports, Student

Council, and a Social Justice Club.

McCreary School, with the support of Turtle River School Division, prides itself on its ability to keep up with technological advances. The McCreary School Industrial Arts Shop boasts advanced, state of the art machinery and programming utilizing a 3D printer, and a CNC router. The New Electrical shop was just built and has the latest cutting edge technology.

McCreary School has a Smart Board / LOFT TV in every classroom, a couple sets of devices that are portable and accessible to students in the forms of ipads and laptops that students use within the school. When a student enters Grade 9, they are provided with a brand new laptop to use

for all of High School. They are then allowed to keep this laptop if they graduate with us.

McCreary School strives to maintain an atmosphere that is welcoming, inclusive, and safe for all students from all diversities, and engages all students in their learning and growth.

Sports

In the first completely “normal” school year since the Pandemic, McCreary School returned with a full slate of sports where many of our teams and individual athletes had great success at multiple levels of competition. The highlights below don’t begin to encompass the hard work of all our Maverick athletes!

Cross Country: We had five athletes participate at zones, with Kyle earning the Zone 8 Championship. All five runners advanced to compete at Provincials. **Varsity Girls Soccer:** The team advanced to Aones where they dropped a hard-fought final to SVRSS. **Varsity Boys Volleyball:** The boys won multiple tournaments, including Divisionals and Zones, and advanced to provincials where they eventually finished fourth overall. **Badminton:** We had seven athletes advance to Zones where Cyan finished second, earning a spot at provincials. Kyle and Stacey were Zone 8 champions, also advancing to Provincials where they eventually finished 10th overall. **Track and Field:** Seven athletes placed high enough at Zones to move onto provincials where we had multiples successful showings highlighted by Cameryn finishing 8th in shotput and Stacey finishing 10th in the Pentathlon.



Student Council Highlights

Grades 5 to 12 Student Council were able to plan Spirit Days, a couple School Dances, and some Activity Days. We did class elections and went to a Leadership Conference. We had a lot of fun and brought back our School Canteen and a Student Lounge. Hot Chocolate Tuesdays were a big hit during the winter months. Lots of the money fundraised went towards sports equipment for use during recess, the student lounge, to make our events such as our dances totally free, as well as to help start the fundraising for a new play structure.

Social Justice Highlights

McCreary School's Social Justice Club was very busy this year trying to make a difference in our local and global community. Some of the activities that the Social Justice Club were involved in this year included: fundraising efforts, organizing a student-wide empowerment Day of Pink, and collecting food items for our community's local food hampers.



Provincial Assessments

Grade 3 Provincial Results -FALL 2022

Numeracy: Students meeting outcomes in each of the areas included:

- patterning—53%/53%/53%
- meaning of equal symbol—67%/57%/50%
- whole numbers —47%/57%/61 %
- mental math strategies—80%/53%/54%

Reading: Students meeting outcomes in each of the 3 area included:

School/Division/Province

- Reflects and sets goals 53%/49%/56%
- Uses strategies to make meaning of text—47%/43%/55%
- Demonstrates comprehension—53%/43%/56%

Overall, we need to focus on whole numbers in mathematics in our early years and continue to work in our reading comprehension and use of strategies.
